Proceedings of the Sheridan County Commissioners.

The Sheridan County Board of Commissioners met at the Courthouse on September 8, 2020.

Present at the Courthouse were Commissioner James Krotz, Clerk Sindy Coburn and Assessor Tina Skinner. Attending via ZOOM were Chairman Loren Paul and Commissioner Bruce Messersmith

Acting as the Board of Equalization (BOE) the Commissioners considered a Correction Sheet presented by Assessor Tina Skinner that would create one new parcel ID number for a lot and a mobile home owned by Elsie Garrett of Clinton. The Board approved the Correction Sheet.

Jeremy Harris of MANNA Systems appeared to present a cost analysis of the IT services provided to the County by his firm under the terms of our Managed Service Plan. To date the County has saved \$4,333. The Commissioners directed Harris to proceed with the establishment of an e-mail domain for Sheridan County.

Sandy Heesacker of SACKER'S in Hay Springs appeared to request the approval of an application to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission for a Special Designated License (SDL). The SDL would permit the sale of alcohol at the Farmer's Market to be held at Galyen Farms on October 3 from 10:00 a.m. – 6:00p.m. The Commissioners approved the request.

Road Superintendent Richard Cross reported that scheduled construction projects for the year have now been completed. Crews have been hauling gravel and water to fill "blowouts" caused very dry conditions. Leonard Smith appeared to request a cost share agreement for a section of 450th Lane that the County has vacated. No action was taken but the Commissioners and Road Superintendent will explore the matter further.

Marie Nelson, Extension Service 4-H Assistant, reported on recent activities with youth in the County. Among those activities were an "up-cycling" workshop, consulting with a UNL committee developing curriculum for home-schooling and assisting with the publication of an article for the general public on animal by-products.

The proposed 2020-2021 Budget will be presented to the public for review, discussion and approval on September 15.

The next scheduled meeting of the Commissioners will be Tuesday September 15 at 9:00 at the Courthouse.
