

Proceedings of the Commissioners

The Sheridan County Board of Commissioners (BOC) met on Tuesday November 29, 2022, at the County Courthouse. Notice of the meeting was published on the county website sheridancounty.ne.gov. The meeting was open to the public and a ZOOM connection was also available. Present were Chairman Bruce Messersmith, Commissioners Dan Kling and James Krotz, Clerk Sindy Coburn, Treasurer Renee Thies and Clerk of the District Court Carol Stouffer.

Treasurer Renee Thies reported that several weeks after the BOC, on the advice counsel, struck the personal property tax for the Gordon Shopko store (now in bankruptcy) the company submitted a check to the County for 6748.32.

The BOC approved Resolution 2022-32 establishing a Master Agreement with the Nebraska Department of Transportation regarding the preservation of land survey corners.

Road Superintendent Richard Cross reported that 135 – 140 of the replacement E-911 signs have been replaced. About 300 replacements remain. Signs designating a Truck Route along 320th Lane between Hwy 20 and 580th Road have now been installed.

Building Superintendent Jeff Davis met with the Board to discuss the electrical work needed to install new security doors in the jail.

Sheriff Jeff Brewer informed the Board that the replacement of aging patrol vehicles is taking longer than expected because manufacturers are producing too few vehicles with heavy duty “police package” options to meet demand.

The next meeting of the Board is scheduled for Tuesday, December 13.

The minutes of this and all meetings of the Board of Commissioners will be available to the public at the office of the Sheridan County Clerk and now are available online at sheridancounty.ne.gov. All meetings of the Board of Commissioners are held in compliance with Nebraska Open Meetings Act and the public is always welcome.
