

Proceedings of the Commissioners

The Sheridan County Board of Commissioners (BOC) met on Tuesday, October 28, 2025, at the County Courthouse. Notice of the meeting was published in the Sheridan County Journal Star and on the County website sheridancountyne.gov. The meeting was open to the public and a ZOOM connection was also available. Present were Chairman James Krotz, Commissioners Bruce Messersmith and Dan Kling, Clerk Sindy Coburn, Treasurer Renee Thies and Clerk of the District Court Carol Stouffer.

There was no business for the Board of Equalization.

Action on the appointment of new member of the Extension Board was tabled pending the receipt of written request.

Treasurer Renee Thies presented her report on pledged securities from the County's depository banks holding more than the FDIC maximum insured amounts.

Thies also presented her list of Distress Warrants on personal property which she will forward to the Sheriff in 20 days. There was some discussion of publishing the list, but no action was taken.

Interim Road Superintendent Rod Norton reported that roadside mowing was underway.

The Board voted to approve Resolution 2025-28 authorizing the Chairman to sign the year-end certification of Rod Norton as the Interim Road Superintendent.

Building Superintendent Jeff Davis visited with the Commissioners and Officials about installing a water dispenser in the Courthouse lobby. Davis suggested that we delay a decision for a few weeks to see how the new dispenser in the Courthouse annex was working. The matter was tabled.

Sheriff Jeff Davis reported that the new patrol vehicle has been delivered and now awaits only decals and the installation of radios before being put into service.

Weed Superintendent Melissa Grover requested approval of a Force Control action for prairie dogs on property owned by Marilyn Van Briggie in 14-34-42. The Board approved the action.

Tourism Board Chairman Bruce Salisbury appeared to request the appointment of Tiffany Hillion of Gordon to the Tourism Board. The BOC approved.

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the BOE/BOC will be Wednesday November 12. The minutes of this and all meetings of the Board of Commissioners will be available to the public at the office of the Sheridan County Clerk and now are available online at sheridancounty.ne.gov. All meetings of the Board of Commissioners are held in compliance with Nebraska Open Meetings Act and the public is always welcome.
