

## COMMISSIONERS MINUTES

JULY 16, 2024

The Sheridan County Commissioners met in regular session and by Zoom (ID# 87981717732 Passcode# 625274) at 9:30 A.M. All members present along with Clerk Sindy Coburn, Treasurer Renee Thies, and Interim Road Superintendent Rod Norton.

Krotz stated that the meeting would be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Nebraska Open Meeting Act. This meeting was posted on the official County website and posted in the Sheridan County Journal Star on July 10, 2024.

Kling made a motion to accept the agenda. Messersmith seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye. Messersmith made a motion to approve the minutes of 7-9-2024. Kling seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye.

The board reviewed a request from the Gordon Memorial Hospital that had been presented to them at a previous time. Kling made a motion to adopt Resolution 2024-10 approving \$114,232.73 of ARPA funds to the Gordon Memorial Hospital for use to repair the elevator. Messersmith seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye.

Interim Road Superintendent Rod Norton reported that his department has completed one mile of dirt work on the Strotheide Road. All guys are out blading now due to the rain in the area.

Building & Grounds report- Jeff Davis not present.

Sheriff report- Jeff Brewer not present.

Kim Rosane representing Sandbox Golf was present to request an extension of hours on July 25, 2024. They plan to have a band and

would like to remain open until 2 P.M. Rosane also requested to be able to sell alcohol on Sunday starting at 7 A.M. Rosane informed the board that in the Fall they will start having a breakfast buffet and sometimes customers request a beverage. Kling made a motion to grant the requests to sell alcohol on Sundays starting at 7 A.M. and to extend the hours on 7-25-24 to 2 A.M. for the special event. Messersmith seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye.

Sara Rittgarn presented the audit review. Rittgarn stated that most of the findings were things we have heard before, such as segregation of duties. It would take two more personnel in each office to get away from that finding. Kling made a motion to accept the audit report from Casey Peterson for 2023. Messersmith seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye.
