COMMISSIONERS MINUTES

FEBRUARY 11, 2025

The Sheridan County Commissioners met in regular session and by Zoom (ID# 93997918251 Passcode# 625274) at 9:15 A.M. on February 11, 2025. All members present along with County Clerk Sindy Coburn, Treasurer Renee Thies, Interim Road Superintendent Rod Norton and Weed Superintendent Melissa Grover.

Krotz stated that the meeting would be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Nebraska Open Meeting Act. This meeting was posted on the official County website and posted in the Sheridan County Journal Star on February 5, 2025.

Kling made a motion to accept the agenda. Messersmith seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye. Messersmith made a motion to approve the minutes of 1-28-2025. Kling seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye.

The board audited and approved claims.

Rod Norton, Interim Road Superintendent informed the board that the new motor grader has arrived. Norton also stated that he is ready for the 1 & 6 year road hearing scheduled for next week.

Weed Superintendent Melissa Grover met with the board to ask if she could change her fuel card from WESTCO to Bosselman's Pump and Pantry because they offer a 10 cent discount per gallon. Grover stated that she had visited with Veteran Service Officer Jason Hotz and he would like to also.

Kling made a motion to authorize the Weed Department and the Veteran Service Department to complete applications for a Bosselman's

Fuel Card (fuel only) and upon approval cancel the WESTCO cards. Messersmith seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye.

Building & Grounds Superintendent Jeff Davis reported that the furnace in the Gordon shop went out. Fire and Ice had one on hand and was able to install it immediately at the cost of \$3400.

Sara Rittgarn of Casey Peterson LTD presented the 2023-2024 audit. Rittgarn stated that it was a clean audit and she informed the board that her firm will no longer be doing government audits.

Messersmith made a motion to accept the 2023-2024 audit. Kling seconded the motion. With a roll call vote all voted aye. The board stated that they were sorry to hear that they will no longer be auditing governmental agencies and thanked Rittgarn for her services.
